1 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Interview with Richard
2 Bloom with Paul Robbins.

3 So you must be Paul, huh?

4 MR. BLOOM: Yes, sir. How you doing?

5 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Hey, how's it going?

6 MR. BLOOM: Good.

7 DETECTIVE CLARK: Detective Clark.

8 MR. BLOOM: How you doing?

15 too. When the movie -- when Nemo came out.

16 This is my girlfriend, Tessa.

17 MS. BASLER: Hi.

18 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: How you doing?

19 MS. BASLER: Good.

20 MR. BLOOM: This is Officer Clark and --

21 DETECTIVE CLARK: Hello, nice to meet you.

22 MS. BASLER: Nice to meet you.

23 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Nice to see you. Paul.

24 MR. BLOOM: All right. Come on in, guys.

25 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Okay.

1 MR. BLOOM: If you guys don't mind, have a
2 seat right there because I have a massage therapist
3 that you can recall --

4 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: What?

5 MR. BLOOM: -- and is not feeling too well
6 right now. (inaudible.)

7 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: I thought that was your
8 dish cloth there.

9 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: Hi.

10 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: How you doing?

11 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: Good. How about
12 you?

13 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Hey.

14 DETECTIVE CLARK: Hello.

15 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: Hey, how are
16 you?

17 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: How you doing?

18 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: Good.

19 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: This is something
20 (inaudible) traffic.

21 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: Really. Where
22 were you coming from?

23 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Downtown.

24 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: Oh.

25 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: It was -- I mean, you

1 know, it was nasty.

2 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: It's a nice
3 little ride out here.

4 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Yeah, if people would
5 drive the speed limit, it would be nicer.

6 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: Well --

7 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Yeah.

8 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: Are you all on
9 fixed time?

10 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Huh?

11 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: Do you want to
12 get 'em out because -- do you have another
13 appointment?

14 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: No, he knows.

15 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: Oh, okay.

16 MS. U■■■■: Hi. I'm U■■■■.

17 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Who?

2 MS. U■■■■: Nice, quiet week, so, yeah.

3 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Well, hopefully it will

4 soon --

5 MS. U■■■■: Quiet is good.

6 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Hopefully here soon we're

7 going to be meeting with his attorney. So, we'll

8 see.

9 MS. U■■■■: Yeah, it's -- it's -- yeah, plus,

10 we're all at the beaches and it's kind of always

11 nerve-racking because --

12 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Yeah.

13 MS. U■■■■: -- you know, when you want to bump

14 into somebody you don't, and, you know, it's kind

15 of --

16 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Sure.

17 MS. U■■■■: You guys keeping busy?

18 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Yeah, it never stops.

19 MS. U■■■■: I'm sure. You guys don't work

20 weekends, do you?

21 MR. BLOOM: Sorry, you guys.

22 MS. U■■■■: Do you like cut it and just say,

23 okay, Friday, I'm done.

1 MR. BLOOM: -- I got to tell these guys to --

2 MS. U■■■■: Well, put her on the stand and let
3 her cry a little bit.

4 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Yeah.

5 MS. U■■■■: Then I'll go on and (inaudible).

6 MR. BLOOM: Okay. So Tessa, you want to have
7 a seat?

8 MS. U■■■■: Here, I'll get out of your way.

9 MR. BLOOM: You guys want to -- wherever you
10 guys want to -- I don't think we have any assigned
11 seating here.

12 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: No, no, not at all.
13 So tell me what's going on with Dr. Rhodes.
14 What's going on here with --

15 MR. BLOOM: That's a very broad question. You
16 know, I -- I don't know -- I think if -- I've
17 known -- if you want a history on what I've
18 known --

19 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Okay.

20 MR. BLOOM: -- of Dr. Rhodes?

21 In 2004, when I moved down here, I opened a
22 new Imaging Center, and he had some device or
23 something, and I had met him, he was -- he was
24 offering this specialized device for imaging. And
25 so the partners and I, you know, took that on, and

1 that's really the extent that I had known him, you
2 know. And be honest, I didn't even know he was
3 practicing back then. That was in '05.

4 So as far as like the depth of friendship that
5 we've had, I think I've had -- I can't say that
6 it's a close friendship. He's somebody that I
7 know. And he, you know, he had -- he did do
8 something nice for me when my practice was closing.
9 He came over in his truck -- well, at least I
10 thought it was nice -- he packed up some stuff for
11 me. And I was, like, I didn't know what to do.
12 But, there was a lot going on in my life at the
13 time.

14 And he said, Come on, you're going to go with
15 me. We're going to go -- we're going to go -- you
16 can come see your patients at my office, okay? And
17 so this was like, June of last -- June of last year
18 is when this happened.

19 So I went over to -- I went over to his
20 practice, I left my stuff there. I said, you know,
21 I'm not really ready to practice right now. I have
22 an injured shoulder. I have to take care of my
23 kids. And I said, and whenever I adjust it, it
24 really hurts. I said, so, you know -- I said, you
25 know, whatever I can do to help facilitate things

1 for you, I will, but I've got a lot on my plate
2 right now. So, my stuff pretty much just sat
3 there. I think I saw, maybe, one patient as a
4 result of this and nothing else. So if there's any
5 billing that was done by -- with my name on it, it
6 shouldn't have been. Because anybody that I
7 treated over there was pretty much pro bono. And,
8 unfortunately, I seem to do that a lot lately.

9 But I do -- I do love my -- I do love my
10 patients and (inaudible) little bit. You know, I
11 felt so bad because some of the cases are
12 complicated that I just want to say, well, you
13 know, if I have to adjust you there I will. If you
14 want me to come to the house, I can do that for
15 you. But most of them, I either owed money to or
16 they had, you know, prepaid, so I just kept
17 adjusting them as a courtesy. But that's -- I
18 don't think that has anything to do with Rhodes. I
19 think that's more we're going off on a tangent
20 about me.

21 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Okay.

22 MR. BLOOM: So getting back to Rhodes. U [REDACTED]
23 was one of my patients, and since I closed my
24 office I said, you know, you can go treat with this
25 guy or this guy or this guy, I gave her some

1 choices, and so she chose Rhodes because of his --
2 his close proximity. And then I think a few months
3 later, she had told me that she was still treating
4 with him and that she had a huge bill, and I said
5 that's ridiculous. She said she had a -- like a
6 \$9,000 bill. I said I don't -- I don't think I've
7 ever had a bill even half of that after treating a
8 patient for that period of time. I said that's --
9 I said something's wrong, you need to go talk to
10 him.

11 And then that's when I found out that Tammy
12 had been working for him. And, you know, I really
13 kind of -- I really had to focus on my kids. So I
14 kind of lost touch with him. And, personally, I
15 would say, I just wasn't concerned with anything
16 else except for taking care of my kids and getting
17 myself back on my feet.

18 But that's really the extent that I have.
19 That's why I don't think I offer a lot.

20 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Tammy used to work for
21 you, correct?

22 MR. BLOOM: Yes.

23 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: And then she went to
24 Rhodes.

25 MR. BLOOM: Tammy worked for me two times,

1 actually. She worked for me for a little while and
2 then she resigned, I think in large part because of
3 my ex-girlfriend, but -- and then she came back to
4 help me out.

5 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Yeah.

6 MR. BLOOM: After I had broken up with my
7 girlfriend. So those are the two times that Tammy
8 had -- she was also a patient of mine, too. So I
9 know Tammy, I know her husband. He never really
10 hung out or anything. We maybe went to dinner one
11 time, but, you know, that's -- again, I think
12 Tammy's a great person, but I don't know her that
13 well.

14 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Well, knowing what
15 happened with U [REDACTED] and her situation, did you
16 ever -- anything ever come to mind that you
17 remember seeing or hearing that he was doing this
18 kind of stuff earlier on?

19 MR. BLOOM: I was never there, so, I honestly,
20 no --

21 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Yeah.

22 MR. BLOOM: -- nothing -- nothing to my -- I
23 know that he wanted to -- did you ever talk to
24 Dr. Blanton?

25 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Yes.

1 MR. BLOOM: She is a wonderful, wonderful
2 woman. And he completely took advantage of her, in
3 my opinion. And -- I feel bad for Deb, but,
4 anyway, he -- long story short, I know that he
5 started a relationship with her in the office,
6 which made me feel even more uncomfortable. And
7 I'd just sit -- you know, that's why I just -- you
8 know, when I can't make a decision or something, I
9 just don't do anything, you know.

10 But as far as anything else or knowing how he
11 was doing his business dealings and everything, I
12 have no idea.

13 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: So, now, when was the
14 first time he come over here banging and pacing on
15 the -- (inaudible).

16 (Rustling on recording, inaudible.)

17 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: -- on the phone? No, no.

18 MR. BLOOM: Let me give this to you.

19 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Yeah, what are all his
20 numbers?

21 MR. BLOOM: This -- I'm going to have to find.
22 It's I've never seen the phone number before and he
23 texted me, "Yo." You know. And I haven't answered
24 him. I was going to ask you what I should do.

25 But the phone -- maybe -- I had a feeling it

1 was probably -- Steve Rhodes. Okay. I think this
2 was -- yeah, this was the only text I ever got and
3 this was on 6/6 of 2014. And that's -- do you see
4 the phone number up there? If you can see it.

5 So maybe is that his work office. I don't
6 know how he texted from his work number unless he's
7 doing that from his e-mail.

8 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Now, this is --

9 MR. BLOOM: This is his first number, that's
10 his original line and this is the one I got a text
11 message, I've never had one before.

12 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Oh, I see.

13 MR. BLOOM: 114.

14 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: That's where the text come
15 from?

16 MR. BLOOM: Yeah. I got one text here and this
17 is the text --

18 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Okay. The other one?

19 MR. BLOOM: Yeah. And then his other one is
20 on -- there's the Mark Smith one, well Mark -- I
21 guess he must have been talking to Mark. And
22 strike the (inaudible). I'm sorry. I apologize.

23 Okay. There's June 6. You know what, I think
24 I did. I think I deleted his whole phone.

25 MS. BASLER: That one day --

1 MR. BLOOM: I have everything backed up on my
2 e-mail.

3 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Okay.

4 MS. BASLER: That one day (inaudible) you just
5 deleted it.

6 MR. BLOOM: Is that what I did?

7 MS. BASLER: Yeah.

8 MR. BLOOM: I was stressing out and I'm like,
9 I don't want to talk to him.

10 MS. BASLER: Because he didn't -- you didn't
11 even want to like --

12 MR. BLOOM: Open it.

13 MS. BASLER: -- open it.

14 MR. BLOOM: Yeah, because, you know --

15 MS. BASLER: You know how some phones will
16 show that the person is reading it.

17 MR. BLOOM: Yeah.

18 MS. BASLER: Yeah.

19 MR. BLOOM: But, yeah. Tessa was home alone
20 and that's why I wanted, you know -- I thought that
21 she would be the best witness for that. I mean, I
22 have the e-mails, which I can send you, and the
23 copies -- I just don't know -- I mean, I don't know
24 to what extent it's going to help your case. It
25 doesn't sound like -- it doesn't sound like you're

1 going to have a big problem with this case.

2 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Hopefully, we're going to
3 be meeting with his attorney here soon, so this
4 will be stuff that I can address -- we can address
5 with his attorney.

6 MR. BLOOM: Yeah.

7 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Stuff that he's doing that
8 he should not be doing. And -- so it must have
9 been an e-mail on there about --

10 MR. BLOOM: Oh, I didn't see it. I'll send it
11 to you. What do you want me to send you about the
12 address?

13 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Whatever e-mails or texts
14 you may have from him.

15 MR. BLOOM: Okay.

16 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Try to get -- especially,
17 you said Mark's -- Dr. Smith?

18 MR. BLOOM: Yeah.

19 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Is it Mark Smith? Yeah.
20 Now when he come over, you were by yourself --

21 MS. BASLER: Yeah.

22 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: -- the first time or --

23 MS. BASLER: It was a Sunday.

24 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: -- which time was it?

25 MS. BASLER: And you were offshore fishing,

1 right?

2 MR. BLOOM: Uh-huh.

3 MS. BASLER: Yeah. And it was in the morning.
4 And I didn't answer or anything. I walked into
5 Julie's room and then I saw that it was him, but
6 there wasn't a vehicle in the driveway, so ...

7 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: There was no vehicle?

8 MS. BASLER: No.

9 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: At all?

10 MS. BASLER: Unh-unh. And then he came by
11 later that day at like four, and the same thing.
12 And then the next morning the doorbell rang, it was
13 early, and you were like, Who is that?

14 MR. BLOOM: You have dry skin under your cheek
15 and everything -- like that.

16 MS. BASLER: I know. I don't -- I got this
17 dry patch here.

18 MR. BLOOM: I'm sorry.

19 MS. BASLER: I'm falling apart. Or it might
20 be my tissue.

21 MR. BLOOM: I'm sorry.

22 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Now, when he was over here
23 on Sunday, what was -- was he just banging on the
24 door? Was he yelling? Was he -- what was he
25 like?

1 MS. BASLER: No. He just -- he just rang the
2 doorbell and knocked and then there's -- be a
3 pauses and then he was ringing and --

4 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: How long was he out there
5 each time?

6 MS. BASLER: Probably -- it seemed like a
7 while, but to me it seemed like 30 minutes or so.

8 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Each time?

9 MR. BLOOM: And he stayed 35 or something --

10 MS. BASLER: Well, the morning one, it wasn't
11 as long, but the 4 o'clock one, it was longer
12 because I believe he even came back here because
13 Nemo then was barking back here. And Nemo wasn't
14 barking -- doesn't come back there to bark.

15 MR. BLOOM: We had to go invest in -- we had
16 to go invest in hornet spray apparently.

17 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Oh, really.

18 MR. BLOOM: Well, somebody told U [REDACTED] that if
19 you use hornets' spray it makes the person go blind
20 temporarily and they have to go to the hospital or
21 something, but it's not -- it's not considered a
22 weapon, you know, so ...

23 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: I don't know about that.

24 MR. BLOOM: Have you ever heard about that?

25 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: I don't know about that.

1 MR. BLOOM: No? Oh, really? So see? You
2 never -- I got to tell U [REDACTED] that though.

3 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: I would say that would --

4 MS. BASLER: (Inaudible.)

5 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Yeah, I would say that
6 would be --

7 MR. BLOOM: It could be construed as a weapon.

8 MS. BASLER: And then the next morning the
9 doorbell rang and he's like, Who's that? And I
10 like jokingly go, surprise, Steve Rhodes. And you
11 looked out and it was.

12 MR. BLOOM: It was, yeah. This was Saturday,
13 wasn't it? Friday or Saturday?

14 MS. BASLER: No, it was Monday, right?

15 MR. BLOOM: Was it Monday? I thought it was
16 Saturday.

17 MS. BASLER: I don't know. I'm confused.
18 Because it was whatever -- it was the day after you
19 went offshore fishing.

20 MR. BLOOM: Then that would have to be Monday.

21 MS. BASLER: Yeah. Or unless -- did you go on
22 a Thursday? Because Richard was out of school and
23 then it was Friday. I don't know.

24 MR. BLOOM: It's been a couple weeks -- or a
25 few weeks, I suppose.

1 MS. BASLER: Yeah.

2 MR. BLOOM: He hasn't -- he hasn't come by or
3 contacted in a few weeks actually. Except three
4 days ago I actually got an e-mail --

5 MS. BASLER: Yeah.

6 MR. BLOOM: -- and it just had a question mark
7 on it. And, so, I didn't even recognize who it
8 was, so I sent a question mark back, like -- and it
9 was his phone. It was his phone.

10 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Oh, okay.

11 MR. BLOOM: So I figured, I was like, oh, I
12 got it, you know. And I said, I can't answer that.
13 And then he e-mailed me back, he goes, is this
14 Rick? And, of course, I didn't answer because I
15 just didn't think it was --

16 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Now, the text on June the
17 6th, when he came by on that Sunday or Monday, was
18 that before or after the 6th? Before or after that
19 text?

20 MR. BLOOM: I think it was after the 6th.

21 MS. BASLER: When did you go offshore fishing?

22 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: So after the 6th.

23 MR. BLOOM: Exactly. I'm pretty sure.

24 MS. BASLER: Okay. Because it was whatever
25 day you went offshore fishing with Richard and

1 Mike.

2 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: So the second time he come
3 by that morning, you both were here?

4 MS. BASLER: Yeah.

5 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: How long did he hang
6 around?

7 MR. BLOOM: And my son was here, too.

8 MS. BASLER: Yeah. It was Probably --

9 MR. BLOOM: See if I can find it in my e-mail.

10 MS. BASLER: -- 15 minutes or so.

11 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Longer than most people
12 would normally -- you knock on the door, you ring a
13 doorbell and nobody comes to the door, you leave?

14 MS. BASLER: Yeah.

15 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: He was just hanging around
16 trying to -- okay.

17 MS. BASLER: He -- he -- there's -- like he
18 waited a few minutes and then hit the doorbell
19 again --

20 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: But never --

21 MS. BASLER: -- knock.

22 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: But not yelling --

23 MS. BASLER: No, no, no.

24 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Not saying anything
25 threatening or --

1 MS. BASLER: No.

2 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: -- anything else?

3 MS. BASLER: No.

4 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Okay. So you don't know
5 really what he wants from you guys --

6 MS. BASLER: No.

7 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: -- or from you?

8 MR. BLOOM: I think that he said that he
9 wanted to chat. Mark texted me and I assume from
10 the text, and I did not answer Mark Smith, but in
11 the text from Mark Smith, I guess Steve was asking
12 him to contact me directly or Mark, just to put it
13 upon himself to -- I would imagine that he probably
14 was at the office over there. Oh, here it is. It
15 said, right here, this is the one -- I think you
16 got this because they asked me to forward it,
17 right?

18 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: No, I never got it.

19 MR. BLOOM: I was going to take Mark fishing a
20 while ago. And I don't see him but very
21 periodically, every once in a while, and he -- he
22 kind of -- hey, Doctor, I hope you're well, just
23 saying hi. That was on February 25th was the last
24 time I talked to him, so ...

25 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Oh, okay.

1 MR. BLOOM: And Dr. -- JT is for John
2 Travolta -- is in need of an adjustment, give me a
3 call. Well -- when you can, Mark.

4 Well, I haven't adjusted John Travolta in
5 probably three years. So I know that, you know --
6 and the family lost their thing with John Travolta,
7 so I don't know if Mark is still friends with him.
8 But, it's funny, because right -- I didn't answer
9 that and I just kind of sat there and then a little
10 bit later at 1:39 which is 12:51 -- so for like
11 40 -- almost 40 minutes later, do you have an
12 opinion on competency or character of former
13 employee of yours, Tammy Wilson? Steve -- SR --
14 I'm going to assume to be Steve Rhodes, needs help
15 in exoneration.

16 So I don't know if -- Mark's a good guy,
17 though, he has a good heart, too, you know, and he
18 really truly tries to help people. So I don't know
19 if -- I really don't know if I can even read into
20 that, because I don't know anything -- how can I
21 make a judgment on the relationship --

22 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Rhodes has probably gone
23 to him, talking to him and you know --

24 MR. BLOOM: He's probably reaching out to
25 every single person he possibly knows, I would

1 imagine.

2 MS. BASLER: Yeah, he's probably manipulating
3 him because he's desperate and he's -- you know.

4 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: And because Tammy used to
5 work for --

6 MR. BLOOM: Well, we had dinner with him once
7 and Tammy had said -- we had dinner -- he was at
8 dinner at Hurricanes with me and Tessa --

9 MS. BASLER: No, he didn't take us. He was --

10 MR. BLOOM: Oh, we were there. Oh, yeah, he
11 was there by himself. That's right.

12 MS. BASLER: He was there by himself and we
13 had to go sit with him and that's the first time I
14 met him and I --

15 MR. BLOOM: She looked at her and she goes,
16 This is (inaudible).

17 I'm going -- I'm going -- I'm going, okay,
18 yeah, well, he is kind of -- yeah -- he's --

19 MS. BASLER: He's just about -- oh, yeah, he's
20 funny. All of -- narcissist. Like all about him.
21 Like everybody's going to meet him.

22 MR. BLOOM: Yeah.

23 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: So since the last time he
24 come by on that, y'all haven't had any more
25 contact?

1 MR. BLOOM: No. No. And obviously it
2 wouldn't be wise to even talk to him, because I
3 don't -- I mean alls he's going to do is try to --

4 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: So he was just wanting
5 to -- yeah, he just wants to talk to you --

6 MR. BLOOM: Yeah.

7 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: -- to get you on his side
8 and to find out --

9 MR. BLOOM: Yeah. Because he said he
10 wanted -- he said he wanted to chat with -- the
11 message from Mark was definitely, you know, it's
12 just a really weird message. You know, he's asking
13 for help. I mean, quite, literally, that's all I
14 can think about that message. There's nothing else
15 to it. But, I mean, how can I ever -- you know,
16 Tammy, she's amazing. She's honest, she's
17 straightforward. She's, you know, she's a good
18 person, you know. And so it's, you know -- and the
19 thing is, is I couldn't even -- I couldn't really
20 exonerate Steve Rhodes because I don't really know
21 how his business dealings are --

22 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Sure.

23 MR. BLOOM: -- you know? I mean, I don't
24 know. Steve's an interesting guy. I thought he
25 was just like a really creative guy, because, you

1 know, the devices that he was always inventing, he
2 came up with a couple of things. I know that
3 Rhodes had a business with Mark, because one of my
4 friends, Mark Adamec, he owns the Adamec
5 Harley-Davidson.

6 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Uh-huh.

7 MR. BLOOM: Great guy. He was asking me about
8 these things called "road rags." And Steve Rhodes,
9 I guess, invented them and then Mark Smith invested
10 in them or something like that. That's the only
11 history I know about those two. So for whatever
12 it's worth.

13 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Okay. Yeah. And during
14 this whole thing, nobody's saying he's a bad
15 doctor, that he's incompetent or anything else?
16 That's not what anybody has -- you know, is
17 implying that that's the case?

18 MR. BLOOM: Yeah -- I don't -- yeah.

19 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: You know, just some issues
20 that have happened -- things that have happened and
21 that's why we're involved, so ...

22 MR. BLOOM: Pretty much, yeah, it's --

23 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: That's it.

24 MR. BLOOM: Yeah. And that's why I was just
25 kind of like, I don't know what I can and cannot,

1 you know, that's kind of -- we're --

2 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: I just want to make sure
3 that he wasn't over here, you know, disturbing the
4 area, making threats or, you know, anything, you
5 know, to this kind of nature.

6 MR. BLOOM: Well, you know, I mean, I don't
7 think I would have -- I think, because, you know,
8 this is obviously a desperate situation, I mean,
9 just common sense would tell me that, you know, any
10 kind of interaction with him, we would -- just
11 wouldn't be wise. Unless I knew the guy, I lived
12 with the guy, I worked with the guy --

13 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Oh, sure.

14 MR. BLOOM: -- you know, I could back him up
15 if he was a friend, a fishing friend, you know,
16 somebody I had like a personal relationship with.
17 But, you know, it's funny, Steve's always been, you
18 know, kind of just a business guy, you know, as far
19 as just a -- but he -- he came by my office over
20 the years for adjustments, he would walk in, you
21 know, hey, can you adjust me? And then he would
22 get an adjustment and then go on his way.

23 And I would reciprocate. You know, I only
24 have a handful of doctors that I would give
25 adjustments for, but he was just convenient because

1 he would just come into the office and, you know --
2 and there are many times I couldn't adjust him
3 because I wasn't -- either wasn't there or
4 anything. But, you know, that's it. I mean, and
5 you never really had time to even talk because I
6 was medically full.

7 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Okeydoke.

8 Now, when I spoke to you you were asking
9 about -- I don't even remember what her name was,
10 an ex that worked at the office. And so this is
11 the detective that actually spoke to her.

12 MR. BLOOM: Okay. Oh.

13 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: That's why he's here.

14 MR. BLOOM: Oh, welcome.

15 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: -- information that
16 you're -- talk now to --

17 MR. BLOOM: Well, you know, I have to tell
18 you, I'm still finding out some things about her
19 and the things that she did in my practice without
20 me being knowledgeable. I'm still trying to put
21 together the pieces of what -- you know, what
22 transpired to the failure of my practice. And I
23 don't know if you're aware of this, but we have
24 another prosecuting attorney that's working on a
25 case for bookkeeping theft.

1 DETECTIVE CLARK: Who's the attorney?

2 MR. BLOOM: Not an attorney, she's a
3 prosecutor. I forget her name. But I can get you
4 the report and send it to you if you'd like.

5 DETECTIVE CLARK: Okay.

6 MR. BLOOM: But that -- all this happened
7 around the same time. We -- my CPA, Lisa Campbell,
8 came into the office and I had a bookkeeper named
9 Trang, who was doing bookkeeping, and she came in
10 and she said, your bookkeeper is stealing money
11 from you. And this was about six months before the
12 office actually shut down and closed.

13 DETECTIVE CLARK: Okay. So who was doing your
14 bookkeeping at that time?

15 MR. BLOOM: Her name was Trang -- oh, you mean
16 the accountant or --

17 DETECTIVE CLARK: Who was doing the billing at
18 that time?

19 MR. BLOOM: Stacy was doing the billing.

20 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: You said the bookkeeper.

21 MR. BLOOM: Stacy was doing --

22 DETECTIVE CLARK: So who was stealing? I'm
23 kind of confused here. You've thrown four names
24 out there at once.

25 MR. BLOOM: Well, bookk- -- well, billing and

1 bookkeeping and healthcare are completely two
2 different things, so ...

3 DETECTIVE CLARK: Right, right. But you've
4 thrown it all out there at once, I'm trying to
5 decide. I can't tell which way you're going, so --

6 MR. BLOOM: I'm sorry. Trang -- Trang -- I
7 know, I have really bad ADD, man, I'm sorry.

8 DETECTIVE CLARK: I do, too, so it's-- so I'm
9 like --

10 MR. BLOOM: So that doesn't help.

11 DETECTIVE CLARK: No, no.

12 MR. BLOOM: You'd probably be good a fishing
13 buddy.

14 DETECTIVE CLARK: Yeah.

15 MR. BLOOM: But anyway, sorry. Trang Lamb is
16 her name, or Vicky Lamb they call her. T-r-a-n-g
17 and L-a-m-b. And I have a friend of mine who works
18 in the burglary division, he's actually not a
19 friend, but he's a patient, and he gave me the case
20 number, so if I --

21 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Who is that?

22 MR. BLOOM: Mike -- Mike Jerowski.

23 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Jeroski?

24 MR. BLOOM: Oh, Jeroski. I got to get -- I
25 got to spell it for you. But anyways -- okay. I

1 will get you his name though.

2 He's kind of -- he's kind of seen the rise and
3 fall and drama of my --

4 DETECTIVE CLARK: What was the name of your
5 businesses?

6 MR. BLOOM: Hodges -- Hodges Chiropractic.
7 Hodges Beach Physical Rehabilitation. And that's
8 about it.

9 DETECTIVE CLARK: What about a boot camp?

10 MR. BLOOM: Oh, X-treme Boot Camps? X-treme
11 Boot Camps, it's spelled with an X.

12 DETECTIVE CLARK: Okay.

13 MR. BLOOM: (Inaudible) her name?

14 DETECTIVE CLARK: What do you -- are you
15 employed now?

16 MR. BLOOM: No, I'm not. I'm doing coverage
17 work, which is, I guess, like Locum Tenen work.

18 DETECTIVE CLARK: Uh-huh.

19 MR. BLOOM: So I see the -- no, we -- so they
20 just call me to cover for offices. Recently I've
21 covered for an office in Orange Park and I've
22 covered for an office in Tallahassee -- two offices
23 in Tallahassee, and that's about it so far. Other
24 than that, I've been unemployed and I've not been
25 able to find a job.

1 DETECTIVE CLARK: Been treating a few patients
2 here and there at your house?

3 MR. BLOOM: Yeah. Yeah, whenever they come
4 over. If they need adjustments, I will, yeah.
5 Absolutely.

6 DETECTIVE CLARK: What, you just -- just cash,
7 no insurance on that?

8 MR. BLOOM: Usually I don't charge them. But
9 if they want to pay a co-pay or if they want to
10 give me some money, they'll give me like 25 bucks
11 typically. But I don't usually request money.

12 DETECTIVE CLARK: Okay. Your overseeing
13 physician when you were there, what was her name?
14 Debra Blanton?

15 MR. BLOOM: Yeah, but she wasn't really an
16 overseeing physician.

17 DETECTIVE CLARK: What did she do?

18 MR. BLOOM: She was just doing weight loss
19 portion of the business with myself and Stacy.

20 DETECTIVE CLARK: Okay. Did you --

21 MR. BLOOM: She wasn't a --

22 DETECTIVE CLARK: I got some more --

23 MR. BLOOM: She wasn't a --

24 DETECTIVE CLARK: I've got some more personal
25 questions. Do you want her in here to --

1 MS. BASLER: Oh, yeah, tell me if you need me
2 to leave. I'll just leave. I can go right now.

3 DETECTIVE CLARK: I mean, it's up to you.

4 MR. BLOOM: I have to ask you something --

5 DETECTIVE CLARK: I'm trying to clear your
6 name is what I'm trying to do right now.

7 MR. BLOOM: Yeah, I appreciate it. Well --
8 well, I'm going to -- I just -- this is what's
9 really strange about this, okay? When I broke up
10 with this girl, I had found out a lot of bad things
11 about what she was doing. She was sleeping with
12 this woman's husband, first of all. And she'll
13 attest to that, but that's beside the point.

14 DETECTIVE CLARK: Right.

15 MR. BLOOM: The truth of the matter is when I
16 broke up with her, I was attacked in this home six
17 times by her.

18 DETECTIVE CLARK: Right.

19 MR. BLOOM: I have video showing this. Okay?
20 The case was dropped, because she went out and said
21 that I had hit her. The case got dropped, and
22 somehow the case came back up and, you know, they
23 say that never really happens unless somebody
24 inside is making a call, okay. This is from the DA
25 and the attorneys. So the criminal charge -- I

1 have a criminal charge that I've never had in my
2 whole life.

3 DETECTIVE CLARK: Right. You have a criminal
4 charge of domestic battery, from my understanding.

5 MR. BLOOM: For -- for -- yeah. Yeah. And --
6 and -- and let me tell you something, I have never
7 been in jail, I have never --

8 DETECTIVE CLARK: Well, were you found guilty
9 or was it acquitted?

10 MR. BLOOM: I pled no contest, because it was
11 under the advice of my attorney, because we just
12 want to get out of here. Somebody opened this case
13 back up, it was closed. He goes, I don't know who.
14 I don't know what was said. I don't know what's
15 going on. He goes, but it's really strange. And
16 he started asking me about some of the law
17 enforcement men that Stacy was involved with and
18 there was some of -- and there are some people that
19 I know that are already aware of it, but that's
20 not -- that's not even what he's asking at this
21 point. So, but -- and, you know, who am I to make
22 any judgments of people I don't even know, so ...

23 DETECTIVE CLARK: Right. What I'm going to
24 ask you is just basically questions about you.

25 MR. BLOOM: Yeah.

1 DETECTIVE CLARK: Obviously, I'm not going to
2 beat around the bush. I'm going to be honest --

3 MR. BLOOM: But before you ask --

4 DETECTIVE CLARK: -- she came in and told me a
5 bunch of stuff.

6 MR. BLOOM: Yeah.

7 DETECTIVE CLARK: And some of it seems far
8 fetched, that's why I want to ask you. I'm giving
9 you the opportunity to tell me versus --

10 MR. BLOOM: Thank you. Okay.

11 DETECTIVE CLARK: -- versus going in and
12 digging into other stuff.

13 MR. BLOOM: But do I need to have -- here's
14 why -- because of the way that that whole criminal
15 thing went and when I went through, I'm a little
16 scared about, like, what's going on with the
17 justice system. And I fully believe in it, but
18 so -- maybe -- and that's why I'm going to ask you,
19 do I need to have like an attorney present before I
20 answer these?

21 DETECTIVE CLARK: You know, that's --
22 that's --

23 MR. BLOOM: Because I wasn't expecting any --

24 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: No, that's totally up --

25 MR. BLOOM: I'm glad you came, that's fine.

1 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Yeah. That's -- I mean,
2 that's totally up to you. Like I said, you -- you
3 brought that up, so I found out who was that that
4 spoke to her, and it's -- I may have -- I believe
5 it's been quite a while that she came in.

6 DETECTIVE CLARK: I think she came in on
7 January 2nd, 2014. We haven't done anything with
8 the case since then. So, obviously, we don't
9 believe -- obviously we don't think there's
10 something there, so we need you to answer some
11 questions just so we can clear it up, so we can
12 close it, is what we're trying to do.

13 MR. BLOOM: Yeah.

14 DETECTIVE CLARK: And, I mean, you said she
15 was doing something --

16 MR. BLOOM: Thank you about that.

17 DETECTIVE CLARK: -- in your office, right? I
18 mean, you could --

19 MR. BLOOM: What, was I sleeping with
20 patients?

21 DETECTIVE CLARK: Well, if you want to --

22 MR. BLOOM: Stealing?

23 DETECTIVE CLARK: Well, if you were --

24 MR. BLOOM: Stealing, yes.

25 DETECTIVE CLARK: She -- you want to tell

1 us --

2 MR. BLOOM: Let me tell you about -- yeah.
3 And the thing -- some of the things that -- but I
4 found this out later, because the patients would
5 come back and complain about their HCG missing.

6 DETECTIVE CLARK: What is that?

7 MR. BLOOM: And I don't have -- HCG is human
8 chorionic gonadotropin hormone. And the hormone is
9 for weight loss. That's what we use it for. Okay.
10 But it's partially from placenta, okay? Somehow --
11 you know, I'm not going to get into what it is, but
12 what I found out she was doing is patients kept --
13 started coming back, and this was afterwards, I got
14 a lot of calls and complaints from the Better
15 Business Bureau of patients who didn't get enough
16 supply. She was taking the HCG bottle and taking
17 half of it out, selling it for \$400 and then
18 selling the other half of it, either on the street
19 or to another patient and she was pocketing the
20 cash.

21 And so I found this out, because we had -- I
22 had two patients that told me that they had a
23 bottle and it didn't look like it was full and the
24 top had been opened and -- but they said that's
25 just the way that it's -- and we know that's not

1 the way that it's sold. So -- so patients would
2 come back, and I go, How did you pay for it? They
3 go, We paid cash. And I go, I have no record of
4 that. And that's why I started, you know, again --
5 you know, started to look into the system and I
6 realized, you know, I can tell you that -- if this
7 will help you at all --

8 DETECTIVE CLARK: Uh-huh. I'm listening, I'm
9 just trying to read through the notes, too, at the
10 same time.

11 MR. BLOOM: Yeah. Basically -- I found out
12 later Stacy was a stripper at Wackos, initially.
13 We went to counseling actually in our relationship.
14 The counselor, his name's Larry, he's right off of
15 Gate Parkway. He's got two Ph.D.'s, one in
16 counseling and one in religion. He's a pastor,
17 actually, too.

18 So he said to me -- he says, I cannot help you
19 with this girl. He says, you're really going to
20 have to make up your mind. He says, you're going
21 to either need to have a lifetime supply of Xanax,
22 because when she goes off, she's going to go off
23 and you're just going to have to bear it, okay.
24 You know, or you're going to have to make a
25 decision.

1 So he told me a really good story and I've got
2 to share this with you. He said, I had a doctor,
3 someone who -- that got involved with a girl and
4 she was bipolar and she was histrionic in -- and
5 this is the profile that Stacy actually has,
6 according to him. And they're on a constant
7 survivor mode. And they have a ferocious need for
8 attention, okay? They're also usually really
9 smart.

10 So that being said, says, that this guy fell
11 in love with this girl, he was going to marry her,
12 they were going to have a wedding, but on the
13 wedding day, you know, she would have these
14 things -- she would just blow off at the handle,
15 and a few hours later, would be normal again, but
16 it was for very unusual and irrational reasons. So
17 when he got down to the -- he says -- the wedding
18 day, she had one of her fits, and this time he
19 cancelled the wedding. He said, that's it. And
20 he -- and he had talked to Larry about this. He
21 didn't name who the guy was, but, anyway, at the
22 end of the day, he says, well, I've got these --
23 I've got these tickets for a cruise. And he says,
24 well, you're going to have to make a decision on
25 what you're going to do. This is going to be the

1 way it's going to be. And he said, okay.

2 So he calls her up, he says, let's go on the
3 cruise. Takes her on the cruise, great time, lot
4 of fun, obviously. Comes back, and she goes, okay,
5 so now we're getting engaged. And the doctor said
6 to her, he goes, nope. That's it. And that was
7 it. He just wanted to go on the cruise.

8 DETECTIVE CLARK: Yeah.

9 MR. BLOOM: So in other words, the moral of
10 the story is, what a great entertainment one could
11 be -- you know, these girls can be. And,
12 unfortunately, she falls in a category of
13 histrionic bipolar.

14 DETECTIVE CLARK: Well, what involvement did
15 you have with Coastal Spine?

16 MR. BLOOM: I know Dr. Formoso. Great --
17 great guy, by the way. And when he started in the
18 infancy of practice, I had asked him if he would
19 refer us patients, you know. He is an amazing
20 doctor with pain management.

21 DETECTIVE CLARK: Same thing with --

22 MR. BLOOM: So I referred to him because of
23 that.

24 DETECTIVE CLARK: What about the ER doctor,
25 Jeff Smotter?

1 MR. BLOOM: Oh, Jeff Smoton, Smowton.

2 DETECTIVE CLARK: Smowton, yeah. Smowton.

3 MR. BLOOM: You know what, I only know him
4 from being at a Christmas party. That's the only
5 time I've ever met him. And he might -- he is
6 the -- the Formoso's not related to them though,
7 but he's -- he's -- I think he's married to Mike
8 Ossi's sister or something like that. I don't know
9 if you know Mike Ossi.

10 DETECTIVE CLARK: From Ossi and Najem?

11 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: I'm sorry, who's married
12 to Ossi's sister?

13 DETECTIVE CLARK: The head ER doctor at
14 Baptist Beaches.

15 MR. BLOOM: I don't even know his last name.
16 Oh, very nice guy though.

17 DETECTIVE CLARK: Is married to Mike Ossi's --

18 MR. BLOOM: Nice guy. Yeah. And I don't know
19 of -- okay. Anyway, go ahead. I'm sorry.

20 DETECTIVE CLARK: Kevin Smith, you know him, a
21 patient?

22 MR. BLOOM: If I saw his face, I might.

23 DETECTIVE CLARK: He worked for JSO.

24 MR. BLOOM: Was he a motorcycle guy?

25 DETECTIVE CLARK: I don't know.

1 MR. BLOOM: Okay.

2 DETECTIVE CLARK: I haven't --

3 MR. BLOOM: I only know one guy that from a
4 very short period of time who came into my office
5 as the things were falling apart that month, and I
6 think there was one guy, he's been on the force a
7 long time, very nice guy by the way, so and he's --

8 DETECTIVE CLARK: He was getting injections?

9 MR. BLOOM: He's my age.

10 DETECTIVE CLARK: He was getting injections?

11 MR. BLOOM: He was getting injections, yes.

12 DETECTIVE CLARK: And you were giving them to
13 him?

14 MR. BLOOM: No, I was not.

15 DETECTIVE CLARK: Now, hang on a second.

16 MR. BLOOM: Wait, hold on.

17 DETECTIVE CLARK: I talked to him now. We did
18 talk to him and what she said is totally different
19 than what he said. He said he was getting a B-12
20 injection, she said he was getting testosterone
21 injection.

22 MR. BLOOM: If he was getting testosterone
23 injections he would have to have a script for it
24 and I could never do anything like that --

25 DETECTIVE CLARK: Right. But he --

1 MR. BLOOM: -- so ...

2 DETECTIVE CLARK: But he did confirm that you
3 were giving him B-12 injections. He confirmed that
4 to us.

5 MR. BLOOM: B-12.

6 DETECTIVE CLARK: Injection.

7 MR. BLOOM: With an insulin meter, okay. I
8 don't remember.

9 DETECTIVE CLARK: Be honest -- be honest with
10 us. I mean, because --

11 MR. BLOOM: No, I'm going to tell you -- I'm
12 not going to -- can I just refrain from that one
13 and say I don't remember.

14 DETECTIVE CLARK: I mean, if you don't -- if
15 you don't know -- I mean, if you don't know, you
16 don't know.

17 MR. BLOOM: Yeah.

18 DETECTIVE CLARK: But if you do, I mean --

19 MR. BLOOM: Yeah, yeah.

20 DETECTIVE CLARK: I mean, what about Lisa
21 Powell?

22 MR. BLOOM: I don't even know Lisa Powell.
23 Oh, Lisa Powell. Lisa Powell from Baltimore, yeah.

24 DETECTIVE CLARK: She's from Baltimore?

25 MR. BLOOM: She's from Baltimore originally.

1 DETECTIVE CLARK: What kind of treatment did
2 she get?

3 MR. BLOOM: I'm not sure. I know she came in
4 for weight loss. She did come in for testosterone
5 injections.

6 DETECTIVE CLARK: Did you give them to her?

7 MR. BLOOM: I don't remember. I don't think
8 so.

9 DETECTIVE CLARK: Who would write the script
10 for the testosterone?

11 MR. BLOOM: Either Dr. Ritterbusch or
12 Dr. Blanton.

13 DETECTIVE CLARK: I think I got a Ritterbusch,
14 but I didn't know what that meant. Ruth?

15 MR. BLOOM: No, Jeff.

16 DETECTIVE CLARK: Okay. I'm going to ask the
17 question, because I don't really know the answer.
18 Are you allowed to give injections?

19 MR. BLOOM: No, no.

20 DETECTIVE CLARK: Okay. Well, I respect that
21 answer. You had three or four different doctors
22 that would write the weight loss scripts for you at
23 one time?

24 MR. BLOOM: Well, we had -- you know what
25 happened, is we had Jeff and Ruth told me to get

1 rid of Stacy, and then I didn't know what to do, so
2 then they end up leaving, because they didn't feel
3 comfortable in the clinic. And that's the thing
4 that --

5 DETECTIVE CLARK: So Stacy ran everybody off,
6 bookkeeper off?

7 MR. BLOOM: Yeah, pretty much.

8 DETECTIVE CLARK: Well, I talked to her for
9 three hours, so ...

10 MR. BLOOM: Oh, my --

11 DETECTIVE CLARK: I'm not going to say my
12 opinion, I just --

13 MR. BLOOM: No, it's okay. I understand.

14 DETECTIVE CLARK: And who is -- and you had an
15 handicapped LMT person working for you?

16 MR. BLOOM: Oh, Lisa Hill. Lisa Hall. Maybe
17 Hall. Lisa --

18 DETECTIVE CLARK: Lisa?

19 MR. BLOOM: Lisa Hall.

20 DETECTIVE CLARK: Uh-huh.

21 MR. BLOOM: Yeah.

22 DETECTIVE CLARK: Was she handicapped?

23 MR. BLOOM: I don't know for sure because I
24 never did the hiring. I didn't hire her.

25 DETECTIVE CLARK: Well, then how come you

1 already just assumed it was Lisa?

2 MR. BLOOM: Because -- (inaudible) or
3 something like that. I knew exactly what she --
4 she had a hygiene problem, too. So I do remember
5 one --

6 DETECTIVE CLARK: What was her last name?

7 MR. BLOOM: Hall.

8 DETECTIVE CLARK: Who was she and what
9 business was she under when she worked for you?
10 Like -- because you told me three different ones.

11 MR. BLOOM: I would probably think Hodges
12 Beach, but, you know, yeah --

13 DETECTIVE CLARK: And do you keep all your
14 records in your garage?

15 MR. BLOOM: Yes. Pretty much. Well, I have
16 some on the computer and some in the garage and I
17 have some scattered here in the family room.

18 DETECTIVE CLARK: Okay.

19 MR. BLOOM: But we're doing a -- you know
20 where you do -- where you dissolve a company?

21 DETECTIVE CLARK: Right.

22 MR. BLOOM: So under the Florida Statute we
23 have to send out letters to all the patients.

24 DETECTIVE CLARK: Right.

25 MR. BLOOM: And give them a certain period of

1 time. So I've already set that up -- or that's
2 happening, so ...

3 DETECTIVE CLARK: So you plan on getting rid
4 of the records?

5 MR. BLOOM: No, I don't need to get rid of
6 them. There's nothing in there that I'm worried
7 about.

8 DETECTIVE CLARK: Okay. Well -- and I'm going
9 to back up a minute because I know you kind of beat
10 around the bush around it.

11 MR. BLOOM: Yeah.

12 DETECTIVE CLARK: Stacy here, she told me that
13 she never touched any of the billing. What
14 actually did Stacy -- I mean, let's -- let's -- you
15 know, let's try to keep the feelings out of it.
16 What actually did she do there? What was her title
17 and what was her daily operations?

18 MR. BLOOM: She was the office manager.

19 DETECTIVE CLARK: Okay.

20 MR. BLOOM: And she pretty much did anything
21 outside of adjusting patients.

22 DETECTIVE CLARK: And she did PR and
23 marketing?

24 MR. BLOOM: She did -- I think she did some of
25 that, yeah. But she didn't really do much of that.

1 She just kind of -- yeah, she did -- she did do,
2 you know -- now, that I look back, I mean, she
3 pretty much did whatever she wanted. She came --
4 came up when she wanted, she left when she wanted.

5 DETECTIVE CLARK: What kind of involvement did
6 you have with Foster Cullum?

7 MR. BLOOM: None. Foster Cullum?

8 DETECTIVE CLARK: Uh-huh.

9 MR. BLOOM: Absolutely none.

10 DETECTIVE CLARK: Do you know who he is?

11 MR. BLOOM: Yeah, I know who he is, yeah.

12 DETECTIVE CLARK: What's your opinion of him?

13 MR. BLOOM: I don't even know him. I just
14 know his face.

15 DETECTIVE CLARK: You just know who he is?

16 MR. BLOOM: I know Stacy said that she used to
17 work for him and he tried to pick her up and he put
18 her desk next to his and, you know, the only -- you
19 know, and I'm going to tell you something about --
20 there's so -- I don't know how far I should go
21 with, like, what I know about Stacy, what she has
22 told me, because, honestly, I don't even know
23 what's true with her sometimes, because I find out
24 that most of the stuff that she says is not true.

25 DETECTIVE CLARK: Well, she did work for

1 Foster Cullum, I know that.

2 MR. BLOOM: Yeah, but, no, I've never worked
3 with him. I've never -- I've never -- I've never
4 hung out with him. I've never even talked to him.
5 I've never had any association whatsoever with him.

6 DETECTIVE CLARK: What about Erin Marshall.
7 Does that name sound familiar?

8 MR. BLOOM: Oh, Erin Marshall, yeah, she hates
9 me. She's probably one of the few people that
10 dislikes me and she's a -- she's a real drama
11 queen.

12 DETECTIVE CLARK: Why? Because if I go talk
13 to her --

14 MR. BLOOM: We had a falling out --

15 DETECTIVE CLARK: -- I want to understand why
16 she's going to give me a jaded -- jaded opinion.

17 MR. BLOOM: No, no, no, that's fine. No, I
18 don't know why she -- she might -- she probably
19 doesn't like me because I'm not that organized, to
20 be honest with you. But, you know, I don't think I
21 ever did anything personally to hurt Erin or to --

22 DETECTIVE CLARK: Okay.

23 MR. BLOOM: I think she had some issues with
24 payroll, because one time she had an attorney call
25 me for something in reference to payroll and I

1 talked to him, but I straightened it out.

2 DETECTIVE CLARK: And you had Physicians'
3 Billing work for you at one time?

4 MR. BLOOM: At one time.

5 DETECTIVE CLARK: Carol -- or Darrell Du- --

6 MR. BLOOM: That's a different company
7 actually.

8 DETECTIVE CLARK: Is it different?

9 MR. BLOOM: Yeah. That's called KD Billing.

10 DETECTIVE CLARK: Okay. What is -- what's the
11 last name? Darrell what?

12 MR. BLOOM: Darrell Delikat.

13 DETECTIVE CLARK: Delikat. And what was --
14 Kari and Darrell Delikat?

15 MR. BLOOM: They're a husband and wife team in
16 Philadel- -- based out of Pittsburgh. And they did
17 some billing.

18 DETECTIVE CLARK: Are they still -- is this
19 still an active company?

20 MR. BLOOM: I think so.

21 DETECTIVE CLARK: Okay.

22 MR. BLOOM: She just -- she just -- she just
23 tried to friend me on LinkedIn.

24 DETECTIVE CLARK: Okay. What about Medicare
25 patients, what did you do with Medicare patients?

1 MR. BLOOM: I didn't see Medicare patients.
2 If I -- I didn't see Medicare, because I wasn't in
3 Medicare patients, so I didn't see Medicare
4 patients. If they did come in -- oh, we did have
5 some Medicare patients, they would pay cash and
6 then we would -- they were supposed to get --
7 supposed to get some kind of a receipt or
8 something, a statement, just like any other --

9 DETECTIVE CLARK: Okay. So they were paying
10 cash?

11 MR. BLOOM: Usually.

12 DETECTIVE CLARK: You never try to bill
13 under -- you never tried to billed Medicare?

14 MR. BLOOM: I mean, I lost my credentialing.
15 When Stacy was in charge of credentialing, I lost
16 my credentialing through Medicare, so I don't know
17 how I could have.

18 DETECTIVE CLARK: Right. Well, I mean,
19 that's -- that's -- actually Medicare fraud is
20 actually huge now. They're wanting to --

21 MR. BLOOM: Oh, gosh.

22 DETECTIVE CLARK: Yeah.

23 MR. BLOOM: Maybe it's a good thing that I
24 didn't see hardly any Medicare patients.

25 DETECTIVE CLARK: Well, what kind of

1 involvement did you have with Ossi & Najem law
2 firm?

3 MR. BLOOM: Ossi and Najem?

4 DETECTIVE CLARK: Uh-huh.

5 MR. BLOOM: The only involvement I've ever had
6 with them is I've had a few cases, U[REDACTED] was one of
7 them. And she was actually sent to me randomly
8 through Mark Smith. I mean, he saw her and she
9 said, there are three different doctors here in
10 town and, you know, Dr. Bloom is one of them. And
11 she goes, oh, I know Dr. Bloom. And so then she
12 came over and --

13 DETECTIVE CLARK: You didn't have a -- you
14 don't have a deal worked out with Ossi?

15 MR. BLOOM: No. Gosh, no. That's --
16 they're -- they're -- no. What kind of a deal
17 would that be? Like a kickback deal or something?

18 DETECTIVE CLARK: There's all kind of deals
19 out there.

20 MR. BLOOM: I just -- yeah.

21 DETECTIVE CLARK: I mean, most of the cases
22 that we're working with different chiropractors,
23 it's definitely going on.

24 MR. BLOOM: And I understand that. And you
25 know what, I do -- I understand what you're saying,

1 and absolutely not. Absolutely not.

2 DETECTIVE CLARK: Why does Beaches Rehab --
3 why did I write -- what's the deal with Beaches
4 Rehab?

5 MR. BLOOM: She's trying to create a lot of
6 distractions, isn't she? I think -- you know what
7 I think? I think she's done something really,
8 really bad and I think that -- and I think that she
9 might be covering her tracks. Because if you -- if
10 you listen to the way that everything is kind of
11 mixed in with how -- how right in here, you can
12 tell that there's something -- why would she go to
13 such extremes for it being -- she's --

14 DETECTIVE CLARK: And your kids, they were
15 involved in an accident?

16 MR. BLOOM: My kids were, yeah.

17 DETECTIVE CLARK: When was the accident?

18 MR. BLOOM: There were two different
19 accidents. And we -- I don't know exactly, I can
20 get the dates for you though.

21 DETECTIVE CLARK: What state were they in when
22 they had the accidents?

23 MR. BLOOM: In Florida.

24 DETECTIVE CLARK: And who was the insurance
25 company?

1 MR. BLOOM: USAA.

2 DETECTIVE CLARK: And you treated your own
3 children, correct?

4 MR. BLOOM: I treated my kids, yeah.

5 DETECTIVE CLARK: Okay. Now, I'm going to ask
6 you this and, obviously, I -- I got to do some
7 checking on it because it's --

8 MR. BLOOM: That's okay. That's fine.

9 DETECTIVE CLARK: It's -- and I'm -- it's
10 pretty simple to find out.

11 MR. BLOOM: Yeah, that's fine.

12 DETECTIVE CLARK: How often do you have your
13 kids?

14 MR. BLOOM: Not very often.

15 DETECTIVE CLARK: What year were they in the
16 accident?

17 MR. BLOOM: I think it was 2010 or '11, but I
18 can get that for you. I'm just not sure of the
19 year.

20 DETECTIVE CLARK: That's fine, I just -- what
21 was your custody agreement at that point?

22 MR. BLOOM: I don't -- I don't -- it was -- as
23 far as the kids are concerned?

24 DETECTIVE CLARK: Yeah, like, did you have
25 them every weekend, every month? Every -- I

1 mean -- because I know it's different --

2 MR. BLOOM: You're talking about -- okay.
3 When you ask that, it is such a general question.
4 Let me tell you what happened.

5 DETECTIVE CLARK: Okay.

6 MR. BLOOM: There was a time when I left this
7 house, okay? And, you know, I had found out that
8 all of the money that we had saved for was
9 completely gone, and my wife was getting ready to
10 file for divorce. And then she tried to blame this
11 on Stacy, and it wasn't about that. But I'm going
12 to tell you something, there is a time where I was
13 living in my car and I had no place to live, so you
14 can be talking about that time.

15 Or are you talking about the time after there
16 was a file for divorce and she had residence in the
17 home? Because I didn't really treat the kids very
18 much after that, because I didn't see them very
19 much. And, yes, you can find that out very easily,
20 but I can't give you --

21 DETECTIVE CLARK: Right. That's why I'm
22 asking you.

23 MR. BLOOM: Yeah. If you're asking me, like,
24 I literally -- listen, I'm the kind of guy that I
25 would literally have to sit down on a piece of

1 paper and look at it and say, okay, this is -- you
2 know, this is what I got.

3 DETECTIVE CLARK: And who's Lacy Powell?

4 MR. BLOOM: Lacy Powell is my daughter's
5 friend and she was in an accident with my daughter.

6 DETECTIVE CLARK: That's the accident I'm
7 talking about.

8 MR. BLOOM: That was like in 2011 or 2012, I
9 think.

10 DETECTIVE CLARK: Okay.

11 MR. BLOOM: Yeah.

12 DETECTIVE CLARK: And what was your custody
13 agreement at that time with your kids? You think
14 that -- did you only have them during the holidays?

15 MR. BLOOM: There was no custody arrangement
16 and here's why --

17 DETECTIVE CLARK: Okay.

18 MR. BLOOM: -- my wife got temporary use of
19 the home. The children were never part of our
20 argument or any divorce. We didn't fight over what
21 to do with them. We let them choose pretty much
22 and try to do the best we can with them. And that
23 was my primary focus is the kids.

24 Julia actually did live with me for a short
25 period of time. But I don't know if the custody

1 agreement was with -- with -- the custody agreement
2 was -- if there was -- there wasn't a custody
3 agreement, so I can tell you --

4 DETECTIVE CLARK: And they are in Rhode
5 Island? That's where they live now?

6 MR. BLOOM: No, Delaware.

7 DETECTIVE CLARK: Did they ever live in Rhode
8 Island?

9 MR. BLOOM: Wait, Julia doesn't live in
10 Delaware. No, never. She must have been --

11 DETECTIVE CLARK: I could be wrong on the
12 Rhode Island. I didn't write that down, so don't
13 hold that against her.

14 MR. BLOOM: Okay.

15 DETECTIVE CLARK: Going off memory of six
16 months ago, so ...

17 MR. BLOOM: Yeah.

18 DETECTIVE CLARK: I've had a lot --

19 MR. BLOOM: Yeah. I understand.

20 DETECTIVE CLARK: -- six months ago.
21 And how many times do you think you treated
22 your kids?

23 MR. BLOOM: I don't know, but not many.

24 DETECTIVE CLARK: And you billed USAA?

25 MR. BLOOM: Billed USAA, yeah.

1 DETECTIVE CLARK: Okay. And what's their
2 mother's name?

3 MR. BLOOM: Mary Valenti-Bloom.

4 DETECTIVE CLARK: Mary Bloom?

5 MR. BLOOM: Uh-huh.

6 DETECTIVE CLARK: Y'all got a good
7 relationship?

8 MR. BLOOM: But I have a question for you?
9 When you say "treating my kids," are you talking
10 about for the first accident or the second one?

11 DETECTIVE CLARK: I don't know.

12 MR. BLOOM: Because there were two accidents.

13 DETECTIVE CLARK: That's what I got to figure
14 out. That's why I'm asking general questions,
15 because I don't know the --

16 MR. BLOOM: Got it. Okay. Well, there were
17 two accidents. So, specifically, one was with my
18 ex-wife and they were coming in from -- on
19 Wednesday night they have this thing for kids for
20 church and it was a -- it was like a big thing.
21 And then another -- believe it or not, another kid
22 coming home with his lights out, hit them over here
23 in Atlantic Beach. And then that was like in 2009
24 and that --

25 DETECTIVE CLARK: Well, I'm talking about the

1 one where Lacy was the driver?

2 MR. BLOOM: I think it was 2011 or '12. I
3 mean, I can look it up and tell you.

4 DETECTIVE CLARK: Right. And Richard was in
5 the --

6 MR. BLOOM: Lacy was not a driver. Lacy was
7 the passenger and Julia were the passenger. They
8 were both sitting in the passenger seat in the
9 back.

10 DETECTIVE CLARK: And Richard was in the car,
11 too?

12 MR. BLOOM: No, Richard was not in that car.

13 DETECTIVE CLARK: Okay. I'll look into it.
14 And if I've got any questions, he's got your
15 number, I'll call you. Which I may have a couple
16 followups.

17 MR. BLOOM: That's fine.

18 DETECTIVE CLARK: Do you have a good
19 relationship with your ex-wife?

20 MR. BLOOM: I have a horrible relationship
21 with her.

22 DETECTIVE CLARK: Do you have a phone number
23 for them?

24 MR. BLOOM: Yeah.

25 DETECTIVE CLARK: And she's in Maryland?

1 MR. BLOOM: She's in Maryland.

2 DETECTIVE CLARK: Okay.

3 MR. BLOOM: I don't talk to her, but I don't
4 think it's a -- we just -- we just decided it's
5 better that way.

6 DETECTIVE CLARK: I understand, trust me.
7 We're all adults here.

8 MR. BLOOM: It's just -- I just don't want to
9 bring up -- you know, it's less emotional and less
10 drama that way, and it's kind of better that way,
11 but ... (302)569-5381.

12 DETECTIVE CLARK: Okay. I think I'm about
13 done. I have one question: Ruth Ritterbusch.
14 What can you tell me about her as a patient?

15 MR. BLOOM: Ruth Ritterbusch, she was in an
16 auto accident. I think I treated her several times
17 but not a lot --

18 DETECTIVE CLARK: Did you give her an
19 18 percent impairment rating?

20 MR. BLOOM: No. Who gave her an 18 percent?

21 DETECTIVE CLARK: I'm asking.

22 MR. BLOOM: Stacy gave her an 18 percent
23 impairment rating.

24 DETECTIVE CLARK: Stacy can't -- Stacy can't
25 give her an impairment rating. You have to.

1 MR. BLOOM: Stacy forges my name. She forged
2 my checks, she forged my name. She stole from me.
3 She -- we found crack pipes in the car with her
4 husband when Stacy was -- with Stacy's receipts.
5 So you're dealing with a --

6 DETECTIVE CLARK: I mean, 18 percent's kind of
7 high.

8 MR. BLOOM: 18 percent is ridiculous, but it
9 depends on what your impairment rating is.

10 DETECTIVE CLARK: I mean, if you only saw her
11 a couple times, I mean, that's not --

12 MR. BLOOM: No, hold on second. Hold on a
13 second. Do you know impairment ratings?

14 DETECTIVE CLARK: I know a little bit about
15 them. Educate me a little bit.

16 MR. BLOOM: Do you know the difference between
17 the new impairment ratings and the old impairment
18 ratings?

19 DETECTIVE CLARK: No, educate me.

20 MR. BLOOM: Loss of motion segmental integrity
21 is a portion where there's a ligamentous tear that
22 causes segmental integrity. And in 2006 or -7,
23 they came out with a new DSM -- not DSM, but the
24 Impairment Manual, Sixth Edition.

25 DETECTIVE CLARK: Uh-huh.

1 MR. BLOOM: The Sixth Edition in the State of
2 Florida, and this is, you know, this is the little
3 bit of knowledge that I do know, is still useable
4 in Florida even though they have now like the
5 Seventh or Eighth Edition.

6 DETECTIVE CLARK: Uh-huh.

7 MR. BLOOM: The same thing that would rate
8 somebody an 18 percent impairment rating, by
9 today's standards and today's new guidelines would
10 be maybe 3 percent. So if a patient comes in and
11 they have -- and usually -- and usually I don't do
12 impairment ratings, to be honest with you. I don't
13 think --

14 DETECTIVE CLARK: Well, when do you do your --
15 if you did, like if I came in --

16 MR. BLOOM: I just defer to the physician for
17 that.

18 DETECTIVE CLARK: If I came into your --

19 MR. BLOOM: Because Mike doesn't really do a
20 lot of comp.

21 DETECTIVE CLARK: If I came into your place
22 and said, hey, we went through treatments, when
23 would you give me -- if you did give me an
24 impairment rating, would it be the final -- the
25 final visit, would it be halfway through? How does

1 that work when you do it?

2 MR. BLOOM: An impairment rating is when
3 you've reached maximum improvement --

4 DETECTIVE CLARK: Right.

5 MR. BLOOM: -- not getting any better. So I
6 would imagine it was at the conclusion of care.
7 But if I were to do it, yeah. Or I would defer it
8 to the medical doctor.

9 DETECTIVE CLARK: Now, did you have a stamp or
10 did you --

11 MR. BLOOM: There was a stamp in my office,
12 but, I mean -- we've had bookkeeper forging my name
13 because my checkbook was there. I mean, I just was
14 not real smart with the way I did things on
15 personal. I' m sorry, but -- and I'm embarrassed
16 to say that, but I was stupid. I mean, I was an
17 idiot. I trusted everybody because that's kind of
18 the way I was raised.

19 And so, you know, I had a bookkeeper that was
20 stealing, I had a (inaudible) who was stealing, I
21 had my girlfriend that was stealing. And being a
22 medical doctor, going through a divorce and -- I
23 mean, that's all -- you know, that's -- I think
24 that's the only thing that bound me and glued
25 together, but -- you know, when I look back and I

1 think I had my head so caught up -- because I came
2 down here with, like, a lot of money. I had sold
3 real state. Most of my money I have actually made
4 from real estate.

5 And in 2010, and here's the funny thing -- in
6 2010, I think I might have made 60- or 70,000
7 dollars in the practice; in 2011 I made \$30,000.
8 And my taxes for 2012 are probably like 15- or
9 20,000, we're just finishing them up, by the way.
10 So if I was a crook, I would be a really bad one,
11 because I didn't make any money.

12 My house -- this house right here, I built
13 with my hands. I'm good with -- my grandpa was a
14 farmer and he -- I've always been good with my
15 hands, that's why I became a chiropractor. But I
16 built this house with my hands. I took off -- I
17 was unemployed for two years and I did this. I had
18 sold the Imaging Center, because the partners
19 wanted it and I just walked away. And we came here
20 and I built this house with my hands. And this was
21 supposed to be our forever house with family and
22 everything like that.

23 But between 2006 and 2008, my ex-wife took the
24 \$130,000 mortgage and took it up to \$950,000. And
25 then her dad got sick with Lou Gehrig's Disease and

1 that's when I realized she had to be taking the
2 money. She would not show me the books. See, I
3 don't know why I get around controlling woman. I
4 guess for marriage I look very much an alpha kind
5 of a girl. And I was okay with that. I thought,
6 you know, we were doing things for the family.

7 But, anyway, so she had taken so much and I'm
8 still trying to figure out where all the money is.
9 Because we had so much money at one time that we
10 had made from property and real estate sales. And
11 it was gone. And I was like, this is just
12 impossible -- just, I'm half Asian. The math
13 didn't make sense to me. But, you know, just --
14 you know, whatever --

15 But anyway, so I've been caught up in that
16 for -- you know, there's a point where I just have
17 to let it go, because it's just going to --

18 DETECTIVE CLARK: What about Monica Maron?

19 MR. BLOOM: Monica Maron. I don't really know
20 her.

21 DETECTIVE CLARK: Okay.

22 MR. BLOOM: No, I can't really say. I can
23 only say -- I think the proper thing to say is I
24 don't recall.

25 DETECTIVE CLARK: Well, she had a two-year-old

1 daughter at the time?

2 MR. BLOOM: Okay. So like I said, I can't
3 recall.

4 DETECTIVE CLARK: Okay. Well, we're probably
5 going to -- I'm not the detective handling this
6 case anymore, another detective is.

7 MR. BLOOM: Oh.

8 DETECTIVE CLARK: So I'm going to have to
9 brief him on this. He's probably going to have
10 some followup questions. Me and him will probably
11 be in touch with you. We're going to do some
12 investigating, try to prove what you're saying
13 versus disprove --

14 MR. BLOOM: I do -- I do think that maybe Mike
15 would vouch for me --

16 DETECTIVE CLARK: -- if that makes sense.

17 MR. BLOOM: He is an investigator, too, and
18 he --

19 DETECTIVE CLARK: Well, if you get his --

20 MR. BLOOM: I have something --

21 DETECTIVE CLARK: Let me see if I have any
22 cards. I don't have any cards. I'm not going to
23 call him. If you want to call him and get his last
24 name and let Detective Robbins know and I'll get --
25 for me to get in touch with you.

1 MS. BASLER: Who is the other detective going
2 to be?

3 DETECTIVE CLARK: Detective on this case?

4 MR. BLOOM: Yeah.

5 DETECTIVE CLARK: Detective David Morgan.

6 MR. BLOOM: Okay. Now, why did they switch
7 detectives? Did that come from above?

8 DETECTIVE CLARK: No, that came from me.

9 MR. BLOOM: Oh, okay.

10 DETECTIVE CLARK: Because I had too many
11 cases.

12 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Okay. He actually did.
13 He actually --

14 MR. BLOOM: You're overwhelmed.

15 DETECTIVE CLARK: Yeah.

16 MR. BLOOM: You're over worked, under paid.
17 Sorry.

18 DETECTIVE CLARK: Yeah, you should be --

19 MR. BLOOM: Hey, welcome to the -- sorry to
20 hear.

21 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: He did the interview so
22 now he's -- he's giving it to the other detective.

23 MR. BLOOM: Yeah.

24 DETECTIVE CLARK: Because Stacy just walked in
25 on her own. I mean, she just showed up at our

1 office. It wasn't solicited, it wasn't by
2 anything.

3 MR. BLOOM: Yeah, she's trying to cover
4 something up, I'm pretty sure. But I can tell you
5 that, you know, my whole life -- I've started
6 delivering newspapers when I was eight years old, I
7 have given my whole life to be -- to do honest work
8 and good things for people.

9 DETECTIVE CLARK: When was your case filed
10 with JSO?

11 MR. BLOOM: Huh?

12 DETECTIVE CLARK: When was your case filed
13 with JSO? That'll make it a lot -- a little easier
14 for me. What year?

15 MR. BLOOM: Which case was it?

16 DETECTIVE CLARK: You said this theft of
17 bookkeeping.

18 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: The bookkeeper.

19 MR. BLOOM: Oh, oh. Can I just --

20 DETECTIVE CLARK: If you can tell me the year.

21 MR. BLOOM: -- get you the name real quick?

22 DETECTIVE CLARK: Yeah. Yeah. That's fine.

23 MR. BLOOM: Yeah, because -- and so --

24 DETECTIVE CLARK: Because that makes life easy
25 when we go to pull the reports.

1 MR. BLOOM: Well, here's the interesting
2 thing, it's funny, because Stacy's paycheck and
3 Jennifer -- all three -- all the staff had huge
4 paychecks while she was stealing, and I didn't even
5 realize it because I never really looked at it.
6 And that's what makes me think now, all three of
7 them must have been involved.

8 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Do you have a search list?

9 MR. BLOOM: I'm just an idiot.

10 DETECTIVE CLARK: No.

11 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: I've had people with small
12 businesses that have had to shut their doors
13 because of their employees that they thought they
14 could trust, you know, be it, you know, a
15 girlfriend --

16 MR. BLOOM: Yeah.

17 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: -- or somebody didn't do a
18 background check on them.

19 MR. BLOOM: Stacy's involved in a lot of bad
20 stuff. She's got people in very low places. I
21 will tell you that. I mean, I -- I am just going
22 to, just for the record, and you'll figure it out,
23 but she's incredibly intelligent. She is a very
24 smart girl. But she's on constant survival mode
25 and --

1 DETECTIVE CLARK: Well, we've all met people
2 like that.

3 MR. BLOOM: Yeah. So the problem with that is
4 her (inaudible) but it will -- it's coming.

5 (This ends Tape 1; continuing with Tape 2.)

6 (The following recording is two conversations
7 being recorded simultaneously.)

8 MR. BLOOM: Yeah. I need to, yeah.

9 DETECTIVE CLARK: Yeah, June of 2013 is what
10 she told me.

11 MR. BLOOM: Pretty much. Yeah, she -- but
12 she -- she kind of -- she's --

13 DETECTIVE CLARK: She said y'all had an
14 on-again-off-again.

15 MR. BLOOM: She might have (inaudible).

16 DETECTIVE CLARK: Right.

17 MR. BLOOM: So -- but, yeah -- you know the
18 drama mode again.

19 DETECTIVE CLARK: What is your full name,
20 ma'am?

21 MS. BASLER: Tessa Basler.

22 DETECTIVE CLARK: Can you spell your first
23 name?

24 MS. BASLER: T-e-s-s-a.

25 DETECTIVE CLARK: Can you spell your last

1 name?

2 MS. BASLER: B-a-s-l-e-r.

3 DETECTIVE CLARK: L-e-r. What's your date of
4 birth?

5 MS. BASLER: 6/24/74.

6 DETECTIVE CLARK: And do you live here?

7 MS. BASLER: Yes.

8 DETECTIVE CLARK: Okay. What's the phone
9 number I can reach you at?

10 MS. BASLER: (904)323-6231.

11 DETECTIVE CLARK: 6231. Just basic
12 information so I know who I'm talking to.

13 MS. BASLER: Yeah.

14 DETECTIVE CLARK: So, what can you tell me
15 about Stacy.

16 MS. BASLER: Well, she -- you know is -- we're
17 just office or whatever, but she'd just make it
18 really hard to get an appointment or get in or
19 whatever. And it was my husband who told me to go
20 to that office, which, you know, I didn't realize
21 until later was because of whatever they had going.

22 DETECTIVE CLARK: And who's your husband?

23 MS. BASLER: Sean Grubbs. Ex-husband.

24 DETECTIVE CLARK: Sean who?

25 MS. BASLER: Grubbs, G-r-u-b-b-s.

1 DETECTIVE CLARK: That name sounds familiar
2 for some reason. Okay.

3 MR. BLOOM: Mike Gajewski.

4 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: I'm sorry?

5 MR. BLOOM: Mike Gajewski -- Gajowski.

6 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Gajewski?

7 MR. BLOOM: Yeah. Gajewski.

8 MS. BASLER: I guess they knew each other
9 from --

10 MR. BLOOM: Yeah. Gajewski. And then he also
11 had -- there was another guy that worked with him,
12 he's in the (inaudible) business, his name is
13 Mitch.

14 MS. BASLER: -- whatever they are -- they, you
15 know --

16 MR. BLOOM: He's a really good guy. But they
17 split them up. They used to be (inaudible)
18 together.

19 MS. BASLER: I don't remember --

20 DETECTIVE CLARK: Her and Stacy -- him and
21 Stacy?

22 MS. BASLER: Yeah, I worked all the time and
23 he was --

24 DETECTIVE CLARK: Okay.

25 MR. BLOOM: And then they split off into --

1 now, pretty much burglary, and Mitch is doing
2 something else, so ...

3 MS. BASLER: -- he was cheating on me. And
4 God knows how many others, you know.

5 DETECTIVE CLARK: Okay.

6 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Yeah. I know -- I think I
7 know who you're talking about. I used to work
8 homicide, too, then I went -- my last 11 years with
9 the Sheriff's Office I've worked white collar
10 crime.

11 MR. BLOOM: Oh, okay. Oh, Wow. Okay.

12 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: With callout and all that
13 stuff in homicide.

14 MR. BLOOM: Got ya'. I mean, I don't know how
15 you guys, emotionally -- I would need a break away
16 from that.

17 MS. BASLER: (Inaudible) -- one thing is when
18 I went to see the doctor, I didn't know that they
19 were together.

20 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: That wasn't the problem --

21 MS. BASLER: Like it never dawned on me, you
22 know, like, I was just a patient.

23 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: The problem was you're
24 working, you know, 37-hour days plus the callout.
25 It just wears on you, you know.

1 MS. BASLER: And I -- it was like -- when it
2 got to the pleading, it was not until like after --

3 DETECTIVE CLARK: And your wife's giving you,
4 you know, when you going to get --

5 MR. BLOOM: No stability.

6 MS. BASLER: It was not until after everything
7 where -- where everything came together that we
8 knew they were together. You know what I mean?
9 That -- that he was with Stacy, you know, my
10 husband.

11 DETECTIVE CLARK: So were you in a crash is
12 why you went to him?

13 MS. BASLER: Huh?

14 DETECTIVE CLARK: Were you in a crash?

15 MS. BASLER: No, I just -- I'm an esthetician.

16 DETECTIVE CLARK: A what?

17 MS. BASLER: Esthetician.

18 DETECTIVE CLARK: What is that?

19 MS. BASLER: I do facials and waxing. I've
20 seen chiropractors for a long time. I'm just --
21 my -- I always have issues, you know, with my back
22 and stuff. I used to be in gymnastics, so -- and I
23 had -- I had a muscle spasm where I had gotten real
24 bad and my husband told me to go to that office.
25 The reason why he told me that office, which I know

1 now, is because he knew Stacy --

2 DETECTIVE CLARK: Where does Sean live now?

3 MS. BASLER: I think he lives on Powers or
4 something. I don't know what -- I have no contact
5 with him ever since October of last year.

6 DETECTIVE CLARK: Do you have a current phone
7 number for him?

8 MS. BASLER: Unh-unh.

9 DETECTIVE CLARK: Is he still with Stacy?

10 MS. BASLER: No. They weren't like ever
11 officially together, they're just --

12 DETECTIVE CLARK: Okay. I understand.

13 MS. BASLER: -- partying together and doing
14 things and (inaudible).

15 DETECTIVE CLARK: Did he have any narcotic
16 habits like her?

17 MS. BASLER: Yeah.

18 DETECTIVE CLARK: What did he use?

19 MS. BASLER: He had -- he was addicted to
20 prescription drugs, he has alcohol problems. But I
21 don't know if -- I just know he had a lot of, like,
22 prescriptions, yeah. Pain (inaudible).

23 DETECTIVE CLARK: Well, y'all got anymore
24 questions for us?

25 MR. BLOOM: As far as -- not really, I don't

1 think --

2 DETECTIVE CLARK: Okay.

3 MR. BLOOM: -- you know, as far as --

4 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: You have his number if you
5 do.

6 DETECTIVE CLARK: Well, we'll be in touch. He
7 has your number.

8 MR. BLOOM: Yeah.

9 DETECTIVE CLARK: We'll be in touch. We'll
10 let you know what's going on one way or the other.

11 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: He'll be in touch, I won't
12 be in touch.

13 DETECTIVE CLARK: Yeah, he won't be. I will
14 be.

15 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: If something else comes up
16 with Dr. Rhodes --

17 MR. BLOOM: Yeah.

18 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Please -- yeah, please
19 give me a call. And whatever you have that you can
20 e-mail me, my e-mail's on that card, that would be
21 great.

22 MR. BLOOM: I do -- I do have to tell you
23 this: My neighbor came to me just after -- now,
24 you know that I have filed two -- two to three --
25 two more reports of theft and robbery after I had

1 broken up with Stacy and she had me arrested the
2 next day. The next day --

3 DETECTIVE CLARK: You were arrested on
4 May 27th.

5 MR. BLOOM: Which was a Sunday, yeah. Yes.

6 DETECTIVE CLARK: Okay.

7 MR. BLOOM: And that night -- the next day, I
8 came back, my neighbor told me, and they saw her,
9 she came back with her boyfriend, his name is Nick
10 McClain. He is a drug dealer. He's been serving
11 time for drug dealing. He sells pills for her.
12 Okay. All kinds of stuff. I had Xanax in my house
13 for five years, like 45 tablets, that I never even
14 touched, and you can check my background, I didn't
15 deal with any of that stuff. They're gone. And
16 these are just like little things that started
17 popping up.

18 But, anyway, long story short, they came and
19 they stole all my son's fishing gear. That's what
20 really pisses me off, because he -- that's his
21 love. He and I, that's our time together, you
22 know. And she stole all his fishing gear. She
23 stole weird things, like an electric can opener,
24 because she never had one. And I showed her an
25 electric can opener and she thought that was great.

1 So it was the weirdest thing, like, very odd
2 things.

3 And then -- but she stole everything she could
4 that was of value to her in my house. And then she
5 came back again -- and, you know, all of this
6 happened, and I had a "no trespassing order" on
7 her. And I still somehow managed to get arrested.
8 And do you know the police officer sat with her
9 alone with nobody around while she was sitting in
10 bed. This girl is really, really dangerous. And
11 I'm going to tell you, I feel sorry for Camerlengo
12 right now, because I don't think he knows what is
13 up.

14 DETECTIVE CLARK: So what's going on with
15 Camerlengo?

16 MR. BLOOM: She's working for him now. So why
17 would a girl -- and why did -- and then I thought,
18 why would she come here and try to break into my
19 house after all this? She's already stolen what
20 she can. There's something else. And that's when
21 I found a bag full of her stuff and I'm just now
22 starting to go through it, and I'm going to tell
23 you, I bet there's some stuff in that. But, you
24 know, this whole thing -- I'm the kind of guy that
25 when I go into like little shells and think about,

1 you know, what happened, how did I make that -- how
2 can I never let this happen again? That kind of --
3 that's the way I am. But isn't that funny? She
4 still came back, had enough nerve -- she thinks
5 she's that good. I'm telling you.

6 And she's stripped the -- she stripped the
7 screen out and my neighbor watched her, and Brett
8 will testify to that.

9 DETECTIVE CLARK: Well, y'all have a No
10 Contact Order, right?

11 MR. BLOOM: I have it. Yeah, we both went to
12 court and I did a restraining order against her,
13 she did it against me.

14 DETECTIVE CLARK: Right.

15 MR. BLOOM: But my case got opened back up and
16 so the judge had to side with her because I had a
17 pending case.

18 DETECTIVE CLARK: So --

19 MR. BLOOM: And so --

20 DETECTIVE CLARK: -- how do you know she works
21 for Camerlengo? I'm trying to make this go full
22 circle in my head.

23 MR. BLOOM: Oh, this is through a marketing
24 representative that came by and she met -- the
25 office that I was covering for, they said, oh, I

1 heard about your ex-girlfriend marking her name --
2 the marketing person that works for an MRI company
3 went -- took her to lunch and Camerlengo -- and
4 Stacy was working for him now. So -- and I'm going
5 to tell you, I love Camerlengo, but I don't think
6 he's thinking with his head.

7 DETECTIVE CLARK: Okay.

8 MR. BLOOM: So I feel sorry for him,
9 because --

10 DETECTIVE CLARK: Well, we'll be in touch.
11 One way or the other we'll be in touch and let you
12 know what's going on once something develops,
13 so ...

14 MR. BLOOM: Yeah, yeah.

15 DETECTIVE CLARK: This is going to be pretty
16 easy to follow up on. It's just a matter of
17 finding time --

18 MR. BLOOM: Yeah, yeah.

19 DETECTIVE CLARK: -- at this point.

20 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Did Missy already leave
21 and she didn't say bye?

22 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: She didn't want
23 to interrupt you, she had a job interview or
24 something. She had to go change.

25 MR. BLOOM: Yeah. And I've got probably about

1 50 patients that will write a letter about Stacy
2 being here in the office. She would --

3 DETECTIVE CLARK: Okay.

4 MR. BLOOM: -- yell at me. She would do --
5 like, she just pretty much -- I didn't feel -- I
6 was helpless.

7 DETECTIVE CLARK: All this stuff that you said
8 that she was doing, you know, you didn't report
9 her?

10 MR. BLOOM: I don't even know how I would have
11 provided evidence yet. I'm still trying to put
12 everything together. But I'm going to tell you
13 something, I will put together whatever I have and
14 it needs to be addressed because she's going to do
15 this to somebody else. This person doesn't think
16 like the -- you know, she thinks that she can get
17 away with everything.

18 DETECTIVE CLARK: Do you have any idea who she
19 was with or what relationship (inaudible) to you
20 meeting her? Do you know anything about her past
21 history?

22 MR. BLOOM: Yeah, yeah -- but --

23 DETECTIVE CLARK: Do you know if she's done
24 anything like this before?

25 MR. BLOOM: When she was 16 -- she's been in

1 business longer than me, just to let you know.
2 When she was 16 she got paid a thousand dollars
3 from Dr. Orlando to kiss him, that's what she said.
4 She had worked for Dr. Packo. She's never been
5 able to keep a job long at any chiropractic office,
6 you know, but, of course, the scenario with me
7 was -- I was a little blindsided and I didn't get
8 it, so ...

9 DETECTIVE CLARK: Okay.

10 MR. BLOOM: But, yeah, there are -- I mean,
11 there are other ones, if you -- but I don't know to
12 what depth. I just know that she had a very long
13 history. There was a pain clinic that she's --
14 when we broke up, that she worked for, but they
15 closed somehow. The guy was -- they were -- they
16 were a pill mill, and -- I think -- and they were
17 over on University and she had worked there for a
18 little while. And then his business closed
19 mysteriously all of a sudden, too. And then --
20 then I heard that she had tried to get a job with
21 Beaches Rehab with Onya, I think, or -- which,
22 probably -- I'm sure that probably didn't last.

23 But, again, I don't know anything about --
24 this is just stuff that I heard through other
25 people that knew her. And I didn't even want to

1 talk about her. I don't bring her name up. I
2 don't discuss it. I don't want to talk about it.
3 I don't want it -- and I do, I tell everybody, I'm
4 like, let's just move on.

5 DETECTIVE CLARK: Well, she did tell us this,
6 and I will -- I'm not going to go into detail about
7 what she told me --

8 MR. BLOOM: That's fine.

9 DETECTIVE CLARK: She told us something that
10 would -- that could amount to something very
11 important to us. And if we can -- it's going to
12 take somebody talking of the people she told me,
13 which I'm not done. Basically, the first person
14 that tells me about it, I'm going to -- I'll go to
15 bat to the State Prosecutor and say, hey, look they
16 were honest and told us about it --

17 MR. BLOOM: Uh-huh.

18 DETECTIVE CLARK: -- versus the other ones
19 that are --

20 MR. BLOOM: Trying to -- oh, I see what you're
21 saying. I think I have an idea what you're talking
22 about. Well, you know -- okay. I think that might
23 have something to do with that bag I found where
24 I'm just starting to put it together. And I think
25 that that's --

1 DETECTIVE CLARK: I don't think it has
2 anything to do with the bag --

3 MR. BLOOM: Oh.

4 DETECTIVE CLARK: -- but it has something to
5 do with what she said you allegedly were trying to
6 enter in to do. Just think about it.

7 MR. BLOOM: She told you I was allegedly
8 trying to what? Say it again.

9 DETECTIVE CLARK: Enter -- enter -- to do with
10 some other people, like a business proposition, I
11 guess I would say. That's all -- I'm not going to
12 go into detail about what it's about. Not yet.

13 MR. BLOOM: Oh, I see what you -- yeah. No,
14 absolutely not. There's -- I'm trying to think of
15 what could that possibly be.

16 DETECTIVE CLARK: Like I said, I want to prove
17 you innocent, not guilty, but, I mean, if you were
18 involved in it --

19 MR. BLOOM: No, no, I don't -- no, what I'm
20 trying to say is I don't understand what you're
21 saying exactly. I've got to be honest with you,
22 she could have made up anything that takes half
23 a -- I mean, the best liars take half a truth --

24 DETECTIVE CLARK: And turn it into
25 something --

1 MR. BLOOM: And they turn it into something.
2 And I'm going to tell you right now --

3 DETECTIVE CLARK: That's why I'm not wanting
4 to tell you --

5 MR. BLOOM: That's exactly who she is.

6 DETECTIVE CLARK: That's why I'm not wanting
7 to tell you what she told me. I got to keep
8 something -- I got to keep some chips on my side,
9 obviously, to find out for sure.

10 MR. BLOOM: You know what -- do what you have
11 to do and you know what, I'm --

12 DETECTIVE CLARK: I hope it's false, but if it
13 is true --

14 MR. BLOOM: I would hope so, too.

15 DETECTIVE CLARK: But if it is true and you
16 know anything about it, I would hope that you would
17 be forthcoming and tell me about it, which I think
18 you would.

19 MR. BLOOM: Can I tell you something? If have
20 something on my mind that I -- I wouldn't be able
21 to sleep well at night.

22 DETECTIVE CLARK: I can tell that by talking
23 to you.

24 MR. BLOOM: You know -- yeah. And, I mean, my
25 whole life has been for my kids.

1 DETECTIVE CLARK: Okay. I can see that. And
2 I see you're a good person, that's why I'm --
3 that's why I'm telling you this. I'm trying to
4 prove you innocent, not guilty. I generally -- I
5 generally work the other way, but you seem like a
6 good guy.

7 MR. BLOOM: Let me tell you, I'm not -- I'm
8 not always perfect, but I'm something. I would
9 never, never do something that set a bad example
10 for my kids.

11 DETECTIVE CLARK: Okay.

12 MR. BLOOM: Or that I knew was intentionally
13 wrong.

14 DETECTIVE CLARK: Okay.

15 MR. BLOOM: Okay. Because I just don't work
16 that way. I can't function that way. And do you
17 know why? This is actually funny. When I was in
18 third grade I stole a pack of cigarettes with my
19 Cub Scout friends. We went in the back woods and
20 we were trying to smoke cigarettes because we
21 thought we were cool. The first time I had
22 friends, okay. And we're -- you know what we did?
23 We opened the pack and we're blowing on the
24 cigarettes, okay? We can't even inhale, so we're
25 just -- because we think that's what you're

1 supposed to do. Like, that's how -- and I can
2 remember that, because we're like -- it's not
3 working, it's not working. And my brother came
4 back in the woods and saw me, ran and told my dad,
5 and I had to go back and tell the guy at 7-11 that
6 I stole those cigarettes. And I came back home and
7 my -- I got a whipping with a belt and my grandma,
8 who -- my grandma's German, you don't mess with my
9 grandma. She just gives you the look. And she was
10 the biggest 4-foot-11 woman -- 80-pound woman I've
11 ever met. She would smoke a cigarette and she
12 would whack you.

13 DETECTIVE CLARK: I bet you never smoked
14 another cigarette, did you?

15 MR. BLOOM: Well, I can't say that, I
16 bartended for a while, so I --

17 DETECTIVE CLARK: Okay.

18 MR. BLOOM: I'd be lying if I told you that.
19 But, anyways, that was -- but, you know, that --
20 you know what, thank God I had them to give me
21 boundaries and give me something to realize, you
22 know.

23 DETECTIVE CLARK: Well, I'm glad we talked to
24 you instead of going and investigating this. I
25 mean, you gave us a lot of insight about who Stacy

1 Reshen -- Reshen, is that how you say her last
2 name? Reshen?

3 MR. BLOOM: Reshen, you know.

4 DETECTIVE CLARK: Who she is and the type of
5 person we're dealing with. I appreciate that. I
6 really do.

7 MR. BLOOM: Yeah, she used to send me pictures
8 of her -- with her tits against another stripper's
9 tits. Her name is Trina, but she's another big
10 coke girl.

11 DETECTIVE CLARK: Do you know anything about
12 her sister?

13 MR. BLOOM: Elise Robleto, Amanda or the --

14 DETECTIVE CLARK: What's Amanda's last name?

15 MR. BLOOM: Smith.

16 DETECTIVE CLARK: Did her husband die?

17 MR. BLOOM: He died on a motorcycle.

18 DETECTIVE CLARK: Yeah. Do you know anything
19 about her?

20 MR. BLOOM: Oh my gosh, she's probably the
21 most passive, nonassertive --

22 DETECTIVE CLARK: And she worked for a
23 different chiropractor?

24 MR. BLOOM: I -- I -- you know what, seemed
25 like she worked for me for a little while. Stacy

1 brought in her family. Like, that's what she does,
2 she brings in her family, all the people she knows,
3 like -- she's got this cohort of people that -- and
4 I didn't realize it until I started thinking about
5 it, you know --

6 DETECTIVE CLARK: So you didn't -- so Amanda
7 worked -- so you didn't know Amanda worked for
8 another chiropractor or you did?

9 MR. BLOOM: She worked -- I thought she worked
10 with pain management -- I think -- let me think of
11 who though. I'm trying to think. I think I do
12 know that she worked for somebody else, but I
13 don't -- gosh, I'd have to recollect.

14 DETECTIVE CLARK: Was it Doc Tony?

15 MR. BLOOM: She worked for Doc Tony, that's
16 right. Because I remember that -- I remember that
17 we did text back and forth about Colon working for
18 Tony. I didn't remember if -- Stacy would fill me
19 in that Amanda's like -- said it's crazy here,
20 there's like drama, there's all this other stuff
21 going on. And I can remember hearing those two
22 chitter-chatter about it, but, you know, Stacy's
23 extremely compartmentalized, and that's one of the
24 reasons why the psychologist couldn't help her, he
25 said she has so many pathological compartments, and

1 he could see it --

2 DETECTIVE CLARK: I talked to Amanda, she
3 seemed to be pretty level-headed.

4 MR. BLOOM: Amanda's really -- you know what,
5 she's really funny, she's very passive. But she's
6 like -- she's not a hateful person, like, she's
7 not -- but she -- she will back -- those two
8 sisters only have each other.

9 Stacy's father is like her. He's a
10 biochemist, Ph.D., went to jail for making Crystal
11 Meth. He was a biochemist professor.

12 DETECTIVE CLARK: Didn't they make a show
13 about that?

14 MR. BLOOM: And he went to jail.

15 MS. BASLER: Yes.

16 DETECTIVE ROBBINS: Yeah, I was thinking the
17 same thing.

18 MR. BLOOM: And she was in the basement
19 with -- yeah -- and they were in the basement --

20 DETECTIVE CLARK: Isn't there a show made out
21 of that?

22 MR. BLOOM: -- you know, and stuff. That's
23 what Stacy was doing as a child. She had the
24 most -- and she was raped at eight years old by
25 this other guy. She's just got this really --

1 DETECTIVE CLARK: What's the name of that?

2 MR. BLOOM: You know, you can't --

3 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: What was that?

4 DETECTIVE CLARK: What's the name of the show
5 where they did that?

6 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: Breaking bad.

7 DETECTIVE CLARK: Breaking bad. There you go.

8 MR. BLOOM: Okay. So, yeah, that's --

9 DETECTIVE CLARK: I was like, that's a show.
10 I don't watch it, but I know that's a show.

11 MR. BLOOM: Yeah. And then she has a very,
12 very, very, rich Jewish culture that --

13 DETECTIVE CLARK: So you honestly never sent
14 your bills -- you never had anything to do with
15 your bills?

16 MR. BLOOM: No. I don't do billing. I don't
17 do billing at all.

18 DETECTIVE CLARK: So would you sign SOAP
19 notes, or what would you do?

20 MR. BLOOM: You know, I have to tell you, I
21 was having visual problems, too. I was actually
22 signing my name in the patient column because I
23 just didn't even know where to sign, but I would
24 try to sign them.

25 DETECTIVE CLARK: So you were signing SOAP

1 notes, correct?

2 MR. BLOOM: I would sign SOAP notes and try to
3 circle what I did, yeah.

4 DETECTIVE CLARK: Okay. But you wouldn't sign
5 the 15- --

6 MR. BLOOM: But I didn't even sign --

7 DETECTIVE CLARK: -- 1500s?

8 MR. BLOOM: But I didn't sign in the right
9 areas all the time. Huh?

10 DETECTIVE CLARK: Who signed the 1500s? The
11 HICFAs?

12 MR. BLOOM: Nobody. I don't think anybody
13 did.

14 DETECTIVE CLARK: So, what, is it a stamp or
15 you just print it out automatically?

16 MR. BLOOM: I don't know.

17 DETECTIVE CLARK: I ain't got any --

18 MR. BLOOM: -- when we went to the billing
19 company. But, see, you got to remember, Stacy
20 tried to bill on her own. I mean, somehow Stacy --
21 and here's another thing that's really messed up,
22 Eugene Robleto. Camerlengo got \$28,000 settlement
